Final Essay for Harper Lee's *To Kill a Mockingbird* 

Choose one of the topics below, and then write an essay of no less than four paragraphs in which you thoroughly address the question.

- 1. A true gift is, in one sense, an unexpected blessing bestowed by a person—or even, perhaps, by fate. Some of them may be objects, while some may be things that cannot be seen but are no less important. Early in the novel, the children find a mysterious shiny package in the knothole of a live oak tree What gifts are given in To Kill a Mockingbird? Why might they be important to the unfolding of the story?
- 2. Discuss symbolism in the novel. What things or events are symbolic, what are those things symbols for, and how do these things deepen your understanding of the text?
- 3. Atticus tells his children it is a "sin to kill a mockingbird." Explain what he meant, how this phrase could relate to different characters in the novel, and the significance to the novel as a whole.
