^{*}Always pay attention to what you are being asked to do.

^{*}Circle or underline the actual task.

^{*}Take a few minutes to outline your ideas. Outlines make great checklists.

^{*}Avoid passive voice ("It was once said that...")

^{*}Do not just agree or disagree with a prompt. Create your own argument.

^{*}Do not just refer to the prompt or the sources. Create your own argument.

^{*}Make connections.

^{*}Bring in outside knowledge.

^{*}Don't simply point to rhetorical devices. Analyze. Write about the effect. Why is the writer using this particular rhetorical device?

^{*}Don't worry about "naming" devices. It's much more important that you describe and analyze what is happening.
