


Select a passage from Martin Luther King Jr.'s "Letter from Birmingham Jail" and write a rhetorical analysis.

1. The passage can be a paragraph or an entire page or section.
2. Complete a thorough SOAPStone for your section.
3. Refrain from using any of the "botanical names" of our rhetorical devices. Just describe what is happening and what the effects are.
4. Your analysis must be one stunningly brilliant paragraph.
5. On Monday, 11/14, you must hand in your paragraph, your SOAPStone, and a copy of the passage upon which you focused.
6. By midnight on Monday, 11/14, you must upload a digital version of your analysis to turnitin.com. (That's midnight of Monday rolling into Tuesday).
