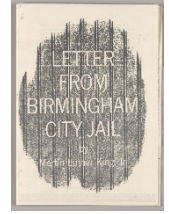
A reader must make his way through the sentence to understand the point the reader is trying to make. The reader must read all the information without knowing what the conclusion will be.
